

A Monthly Mobile Food Pantry in Pollock served families a total of 41,755 pounds of food.

Partner Agency Programs provided 142,973 pounds of food to neighbors through their food pantries and meal services.

**SNAP Assistance** helped **87 families** complete & submit applications for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (Food Stamps).
