

Food Insecurity

Food insecurity is defined as not having access to enough food for an active, healthy life. Louisiana ranks third in the nation for overall food insecurity, and first for food insecurity among children and seniors. Allen Parish exceeds national averages.



496,297 Meals Provided

Feeding Families



Monthly Mobile Food Pantries in Kinder, Oberlin and Oakdale served families a total of **453,063** pounds of food.

Partner Agency Programs

provided **142,492 pounds** of food to neighbors through their food pantries and meal services.





The Community Garden at Greater Hayes AME Church provided neighbors training and space to grow their own food.

SNAP Assistance helped **25 families** complete & submit applications for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (Food Stamps).
